Young Journalists for Democracy Seminar by SCI Germany and HUJ Armenia

Panelists also discussed the importance of building networks of support among journalists and how international organizations like SCI and HUJ can provide resources and protection to journalists working in challenging environments.

5. Developing Multimedia Skills for Modern Journalism

With digital media becoming the primary news source for many, the seminar included a series of workshops focused on multimedia journalism. Participants were trained in photography, videography, podcasting, and social media strategies, gaining hands-on experience with tools used in modern reporting. Facilitators encouraged the use of diverse media formats to engage wider audiences and make complex stories more accessible.

This multimedia focus aimed to help young journalists expand their skill sets, enabling them to share stories across multiple platforms and reach audiences that might not engage with traditional media formats. By mastering these skills, participants are better prepared to meet the demands of digital-age journalism and contribute to democratic dialogue.

6. Networking and Cross-Cultural Exchange

One of the seminar's unique aspects was its emphasis on cross-cultural exchange. Participants from Germany, Armenia, and other countries had the opportunity to connect, share insights, and discuss the differences in their media landscapes.
